### **Housing Progress Report**

Members noted the report as circulated at the meeting. Paddy Donnelly, Director of Services addressed all matters raised by the Members.

The following items were clarified on request by Members:

Refugees - Louth County Council was requested by the International Protection Accommodation Services (IPAS) to identify accommodation around the county as possible locations to assist with refugees from Ukraine. The recently acquired Franciscan Friary facilitated 16 refugees last Wednesday on short notice, another 47 arrived on Saturday morning and were accommodated in the Sports Centre in Dundalk. This accommodation is essentially a rest centre which is safe, clean, warm and has shower/toilet facilities.

Works are being carried out on the Dominican Church in preparation should it be required, however the full accommodation requirement is not yet known.

Any accommodation sourced to date is outside of and in addition to usual emergency accommodation and includes private accommodation providers.

**HAP / HAOP / MAGs -** A total of 630 grant adaptation applications were rolled over from 2020/2021 into 2022.

Voids - Void funding requests are with the Department of Housing.

The following Planning issue was raised:

# **Operations and Marine Progress Report**

Members discussed the report as circulated at the meeting. Mark Johnson, Senior Engineer addressed all Operations Matters raised.

The following items were highlighted:

- Drug Paraphernalia repeatedly found on Chord Road steps
- Footpath repair schedule has been prepared
- Congress Avenue traffic plans are progressing, consultation with residents next
- Lawrence Street car parking will be examined re change of direction
- Stone retaining wall designed at King Williams Glen to prevent further river erosion
- Limited budget for line marking
- Whitethorn Housing Estate junction box cost may be prohibitive but solutions to traffic issues will be considered
- Lifeboat comments awaited on Crooked Street traffic proposal
- Yellowbatter junction survey will be examined
- Broadgate is a protected structure, clearing of ivy problematic
- Marley Court Lane will not be cleared by Council
- White lines request made for Baltray Road
- Tertiary road repair request cited as extenuating circumstances will be looked at, but Members cautioned funding is not there for all approved CIS schemes
- Baltray Road surface works will be examined but road safety is prioritised over bowling
- Private works for footpath on Donore Road owners will be written to again

The following non-operations issues were raised:

- Dangerous structure on public walkway to be referred to Planning.
- Bus stop on grass verge Termon Abbey referred to Infrastructure
- Request to write again to Drogheda Port re Dredger

# To receive a delegation from Drogheda Cycling Group

Messrs Noel Hogan and Daniel Danko gave Members and Officials an overview of the nature and works of Drogheda Cycling Group which started up in 2021. 21 community rides have been facilitated by the group to allow ordinary cyclists to get active and involved without a competitive cycling focus. The group repairs old and unwanted bicycles and can loan these out. Similar schemes exist in Prague, Phoenix Arizona and London. They wish to contribute their voice to works around Drogheda to promote safe active travel around the town.

They are looking for grant funding where possible, tools, assistance to source a shed/workshop for bike repair and storage, space, stands, along with a site to teach cycle safety.
