Matters Arising

- It was pointed out that the request for a speed survey on the North Road in minute 37/20 should have made reference to the survey being requested at a previous meeting.

Housing Progress Report

Members discussed the report as circulated at the meeting and had their queries addressed.

- It was agreed to check the homeless figures in the report as they appeared to be high.
- In response to concerns raised in relation to some rough sleepers in the town members were assured that the Housing Department would assist them if they made contact.

Minute No. 51/20

Operations and Marine Progress Report

Members discussed the report as circulated at the meeting and the following points were addressed:

- It was suggested that flowers and planters should be put in place on the approach roads to Drogheda.
- It was also pointed out that there are weeds growing at the planters on the North Strand
- It was suggested that the road sweeper should clear fallen leaves from the footpath on the Dublin Road which are a potential slip hazard.
- The need to resurface the road surface in the county Louth section of the Rosevale estate was highlighted.
- The need to carry out the planned review of the pay parking on Windmill Road was raised in order to establish if the problems with the machines not working for long periods has been resolved.
- The issue of rats in the Grove Hill throughway was raised.
- The need to action traffic calming measures on Congress Avenue and Marley's Court was emphasised.
- The condition of the road at the rear of 303 Rathmullen was highlighted.
- It was pointed out that the drains in Balls Grove need to be repaired.
- The need to ensure the bottle banks are emptied when full was raised.
- A query was raised as to whether or not the recent works at Spine Road, Aston Village included the repair of the overflow valve.
- It was suggested that the area in front of the coast guard station at Clogherhead should be reserved for parking by the volunteers
- The problem of hard water in the housing estate in Seapoint golf course was highlighted.
- The removal of broken glass from the Glen, Newfoundwell was requested
- The condition of the road and the need for a litter pick from the golf club to the Haven in Baltray was raised.
- The need to address the pot holes outside the school in Termonfeckin was highlighted.
