I am writing to object to the new proposed development plan 2021-2027.

Having been born and raised in the Lordship area. I am completely devastated that these new proposed plans may see my future dream of building a house on a site/land owned by my father.

I have always planned on bringing up my family in the community that I was brought up in. A rural area that would see me, my husband and our 6month old child start our new family life being close to family and friends. Allowing my children to have the same privileges as I had growing up, giving them the chance to build relationships with their grandparents and family members. Having my children attend the same local school I did, teaching them of the rural area history and family farm that has been handed down through the generations, my children being the 5<sup>th</sup> generation.

I find it totally unfair and frustrating as I was born into an established family in the area, helped on the family farm, went to the local school and have worked locally, to be denied the right to build a home on my father's land.

My Father like many other farmers in the North Louth area has a family of more than 2 children. To be told that you the Louth County Council are only permitting 2 children per farmer to build a house on a farm and land that my father has farmed all his life is very unfair.

How do you expect any father to choose 2 of his children against the rest? Do you realise the family arguments, tension and bitterness you are causing between families. This is an absolute disgrace.

I urge that you take the above into consideration. Let the young people of the area have a say. We should have the right to live and build in the community where we have grown up, on family land and as local needs.
