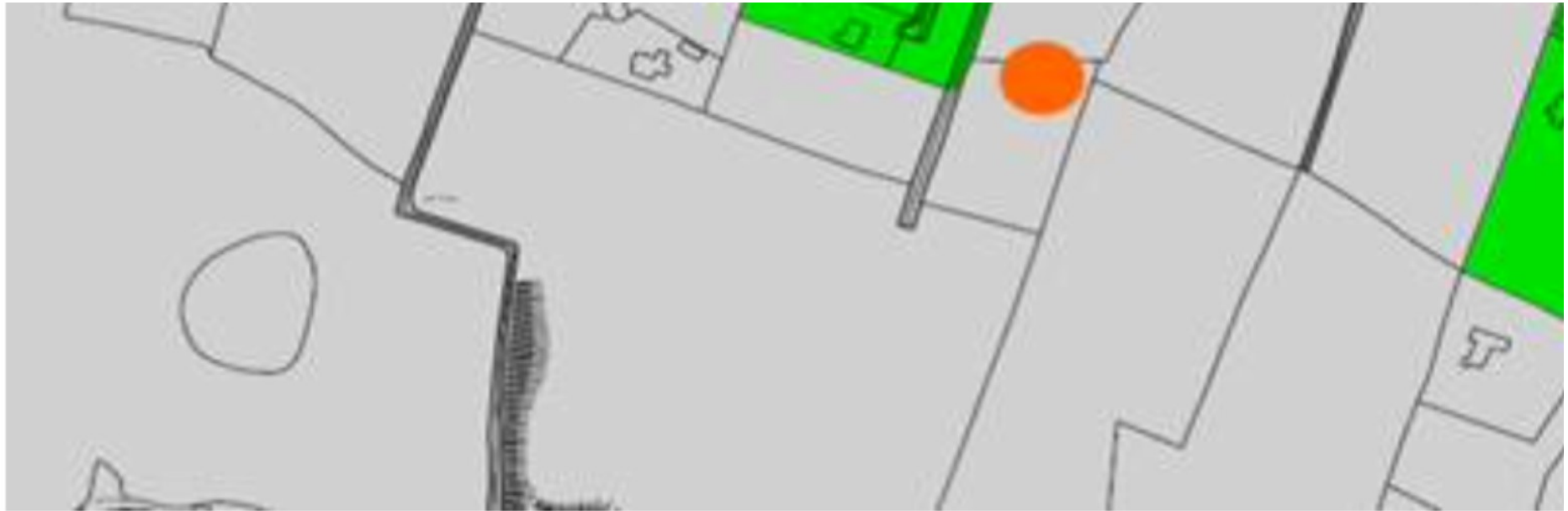

Our family has lived in lordship and for our children to be told they have to move away from the home they were reared in is a disgrace and unfair. They both got small houses in dundalk town when they started to work, with the plan to build on their own site when they could afford it. This leaves them at a disadvantage owning a home. Even though the homes are not big enough to rear a family in. There are so many rules that are going to drive local young people away. They have lived in the lordship area all their lives and went to the local school. We had hoped that our daughter who had to emigrate to Australia, is going to be able to come back and live next door to us. We had hoped that she would be here to look after us as we are in our late sixties. The fact that someone who never owned a home and lived in a local rural area could get planning on our children's sites, it doesn't make sense. We need some kind of provision to keep family's together. I hope the county council will extend the settlement boundaries and make it possible for young people to build their home. I enclose a map of the site marked in orange and my daughters site is between the home house marked with a red circle and the orange circle.
