<b>Name of Creator(s):</b>	John Hinds (1798/9-1873)
<b>Admin/Biographical History:</b>	Reverend John Thomas Hinds (1798/9-1873) was born in Pulham, Dorset in England and married Margaret Dorothea Hinds (1813/4-1871), the daughter of Thomas and Mary Prescott, in 1832. Reverend Hinds held land in Dundalk located in the Market Street area of the town as a freeholder (a registered voter who owns or inherits a property). Hinds also leased land from and held land under fee farm grant with the Earl of Roden. The Hinds' land in Dundalk was sold to John Hinds by the Byrnes family in 1807, which later passed to John Thomas Hinds in the marriage settlement between himself and Margaret Dorothea Clowes in 1832. The land remained in the possession of the Hinds family until 1881, when it was put up for auction in the Landed Estates Court in Dublin. It was purchased by Michael Moynagh, solicitor.
<b>Archival History:</b>	These papers were deposited with Louth County Archives Service in May 2001 by the County Louth Archaeological and Historical Society.
<b>Scope and Content:</b>	This collection contains ten items pertaining to the Hinds family, who held lands in the middle ward of Dundalk. The collection contains the marriage settlement between Reverend John Thomas Hinds and Margaret Dorothea Clowes dated 1832 and largely deals with the declaration of pedigree to Henry Thomas George Fitzgerald. There are also two items referring to the fee farm grant of the land which was purchased by Michael Moynagh, solicitor in 1882.

Indenture made prior to the marriage of Reverend John Thomas Hinds and Margaret Dorothea Clowes between John Hinds MD (medical doctor), Guilford Street, County Middlesex, Reverend John Thomas Hinds, rector of Pulham, County Dorset, Reverend Thomas Clowes, Darlaston Hall, County Stafford, Margaret

Dorothea Clowes, Darlaston Hall, County Stafford, John Stephens, Aldermaston, County Berk[shire], and Charles Prescot, rector of Stockport, County [Chester]. The item recites the following indentures:

09 Jun 1769: Between James Earl of Clanbrassil and Stephen Page.  
01 Aug 1770: Between John Page, George Murphy and Joseph Mouritz.  
28 Sep 1803: Between Elizabeth Mouritz, George Murphy and John Hinds.  
03 May 1819: Between Malcolm Brown, William James Hogg, Graham Johnston, John Page and John Hinds.  
03 Jun 1819: Between James Earl of Clanbrassil and Gerald Byrne.  
14 Apr 1807: Between Elizabeth Byrne and John Hinds.  
17 Jan 1818: Between Right Honourable Hugh Howard, John Metge, Earl of Roden, and John Hinds.  
21 Sep 1808: Between Hugh Howard, John Metge, Earl of Roden, John Collier, and William Walsh.  
05 Sep 1810: Between John Collier and John Hinds.  
02 May 1759: Between Andrew Crawford and Philip Mulligan.

The marriage settlement concerns the aforementioned indentures and retains the income from the will of George Murphy for money from said indentures. The settlement also includes arrangements for the distribution of the hereditaments of John Stephens and Charles Frederick Prescot between the children of John Hinds and Margaret Dorothea Clowes as well as arrangements on how to divide the trust between the children should a child die before the age of 20 or 21 and that monies received by the trustees from the sale of lands are to be invested. Signed and sealed by all parties.

Handwritten copies recording the baptisms of John Henry Hinds (baptized 13<sup>th</sup> September 1843) and Margaret Emmeline Hinds (baptized 11<sup>th</sup> April 1841), who are the son and daughter of John and Margaret Hinds in Pulham, County Dorset, England. The baptism ceremony was performed by John Thomas Hinds. These are the items marked C and D referred to in PP00043/1/2 above.

Copy of opinion of counsel for Hinds' estate by Thomas W Bell to Michael Moynagh, solicitor. Moynagh is seeking clarification in relation to the fee farm grant of the 23<sup>rd</sup> April 1863 between the Earl of Roden and Messrs Hinds Murphy. The response from counsel is that Hinds was the owner of the lease when all the estate of the Murphys having become vested in him and the fee farm grant ought to have been made to him alone. As Moynagh has become the purchaser of the lot, Bell advises Moynagh to get out a new fee farm grant to himself to retain as a root to title.

Letter from Michael Moynagh, solicitor to William Robson, Justice of the Peace, Dundalk in relation to the Hinds Estate in Dundalk. The letter states that Moynagh purchased the estate of the late John Thomas Hinds, which was held under the fee farm grant made by the Earl of Roden to Hinds, Murphy and others dated 22<sup>nd</sup> of April 1863 in respect of properties located in Market Street and Defender's Row. The letter states that Counsel advised Moynagh that the grant is defective and Moynagh now seeks a new grant from Lord Roden under the Renewable Leasehold Conversion Act. It is marked 'approved Roden'.
