Name of Creator(s):	Larry Conlon; Collon Unionist Volunteers
Admin/Biographical History:	In researching the article contained in this collection, local historian Larry Conlon obtained colour copies of original documents relating to the Collon Unionist Volunteers. These show that the Collon Unionist Volunteer Corps was established in Collon on 30 th July 1914. It held similar beliefs to the Ulster Volunteer Force, founded in January 1913 whose main aim was to oppose the introduction of Irish Home Rule, by force of taking up arms if necessary.
Archival History:	This collection was acquired by private donation in November 2009.
Scope and Content:	The collection contains colour copies of original documents relating to unionist volunteers in Collon, in 1914-15: namely the original proclamation and the rifle fund subscription list which provides names of members and accounts. The collection also includes an article entitled 'Collon Unionist Volunteers' written by Larry Conlon, ca 2008. The article gives a brief history of the events surrounding the period from the foundation of the Ulster Volunteer Force in 1912 to the formation of Collon Volunteer Force in July 1914 and includes transcripts of some of the original documents.

Collon Unionist Volunteers' Documents, 1914 – 1915, 5 items

Printout of article entitled 'Collon Unionist Volunteers' by Larry Conlon. The article gives a brief history of the foundation of the Ulster Volunteer Force in 1912 and outlines subsequent events that occurred in the period leading up to the formation of the Collon Volunteer Corps in July 1914. It refers to a manuscript membership book containing the names of members and sympathisers of Collon Unionist Volunteer Corps for 1914-15; to manuscripts giving names and details of a rifle fund; and to the original proclamation of the corps which details its aims and contains signed names of its committee members. The article contains a transcript of this proclamation and some committee names; and a transcript of the rifle fund list of subscribers and its accounts showing expenditure from July 1914 - June 1915 and also August 1919 (War memorial) with a final note for 1920 stating 'cash on hands invested on War Saving Certificates'.
